Every year during Autumn and early Winter, birds travel from colder regions to the warmer grounds. They make a return journey again during Spring and early Summer. They are punctual unless they are delayed by bad weather. They face many dangers and hardships while travelling long distances through the air, over hills, forests, plains, and large stretches of water. Sometimes sudden storms drive them to the sea to be drowned in the wild waves and on occasions they are at the risk of being hunted by the humans.

1. Why do the birds migrate?

Birds usually move from colder region to warmer areas:
